During these unprecedented times the Community Hall has been the most affected out of all of the aspects of the Parish Council. Along with the Village Hall having to close it's doors to the Public in the Spring of 2020 was very difficult but it was what we had to do to keep everyone safe. The only time the hall was in use was by Dr Kumar's surgery for Flu Jabs – which they are also doing in the Hall this year as well. We have slowly seen regular hirers returning and now the WI, Friendly Faces, Teynham Short Mat Bowls & Judo are all back and the hall is coming back to life. We also welcome some new regular hirers (weekly) such as Stay & Play on a Wednesday Morning and a new evening Dance class starting on Monday 29th November (weekly).

Teynham Parish Council continues to support national and local charities through the donation of the hall for events including, Breast Cancer Care, Macmillan, Alzheimer's Society and Vincent's Charity. The hall was also donated for all of Dr Kumar's Flu surgeries as our way of supporting the Community. We also be donated the hall on Saturday 27th September for a Christmas Fayre in support of Vincent's Charity. Following that event the hall will be hosting the Christmas Tree Light Switch on Ceremony outside of the Hall where there will be a real Christmas tree (donated by Peter Butt of Osiers Farm), a blessing by Reverend Lillicrap and Christmas Carols from his choir and all those who want to join in. The WI have kindly offered to provide mince pies for this event.

We have had to increase our charges for the hall after keeping them very low for many years due to the impact from Covid. The new fees can be found on our website www.teynhamparishcouncil.org

Welcome back to Teynham News. During the pandemic it had to be put on hold, but now we are starting again with a new format and Cllr Kate Barnett is now leading the team as our new editor. Our thanks go to Cllr Brian Sharman, who edited and produced the Teynham News for some 25 years. He has now stood down from this role. Many things have happened to Teynham Parish Council since our last published edition of Teynham News. Firstly, I would like to give a big thank you to the Councillors of the Parish who have put in a lot of time and effort during these difficult and worrying times. Unfortunately we had to say goodbye to four Councillors, who resigned, each for personal reasons. These are N. Whittingham (moved to Norfolk), J. Gifford, W.S.Wood and S. Peto. However four new members have taken up the role as Parish Councillors, these are: Helen Dixon, Kate Barnett, Graham Redman and Paul Townsend.

Christmas went into lockdown for 2020. Hopefully 2021 should be ok, unless Covid-19 hits hard again, lets keep our fingers crossed.

Forthcoming plans for this year include a Christmas tree, which will be up in the Community Hall car park in Station Road. The decorations are going to be made by the pupils of Teynham Primary School. Once all is ready the tree will be blessed by our Parish Rector Stephen Lillicrap. The Christmas tree lights will be switched on at 6PM on Saturday 27th November.

Then on the evening of Tuesday 21st December at 7pm, Teynham Community Hall on Station Road, Rector Stephen Lillicrap will lead the carol singers. No doubt some of us will like to join in the signing.

In May we had Network Rail applying to divert the public footpath crossing the railtrack at the West end of the railway station. Consultation took place and many residents attended and aired their objections, some agreed. We are still waiting for news of the outcome.

Planning application for the Highsted Park Proposal, West of Teynham, has been met by a lot of objections from Parishioners. Teynham Parish Council has, together with Tonge Parish Council, responded strongly against the planning application, based on feedback from our residents and communities. You can read our executive summary and full report, that we sent to Swale Planning Office, on the Teynham Parish Council Website.

Many residents and community groups had asked us if WiFi could be made available at the Community Hall. Well, the good news is that we have had it installed and it is up and running for those hiring the Hall. Once again Teynham Parish Council were happy to let Dr Kumar use the Hall to administer flu jabs.

Teynham Parish Council are trying their hardest to bring normality back to the village after such a difficult year. With all of your help we will get there.

News from Teynham Parochial CEP School

Life in our school community has been returning to normal. In September we welcomed our new reception children and this year were able to reintroduce our buddies with Year 6. This is a lovely experience for both the younger and older children. For our year 6 children it gives them more responsibility. They play with the children on the playground and walk with them when we walk down to the church, they go into help with reading and celebrate each other's learning.

In October we had our first challenge day of the year. Night owls visited the school which was an amazing opportunity to see live owls, learn about them and see them in flight. All the children had the opportunity to meet an owl and have a photo taken with them. The children did all sorts of activities to do with owls during the day.

In Term 2 we commemorated remembrance. All the children made a poppy which contributed to a fabulous display. We held a service together which was once again a moving experience.

The Pink Wellbeing garden, which was opened in April by the Bishop of Dover, has become an integral part of our school. The children use the area as a quiet space which has lots of sensory plants to touch and smell. Feedback from the children is that this is a space they can sit and be still and take time to think. In our busy lives it is very important that we give children these sorts of spaces for their wellbeing.

As a school we have been taking part in the DS Smith - How to be a zero super hero. This is a recycling competition where children have been bringing in cardboard that is taken away to be turned into new cardboard boxes. The response has been incredible. At the time of writing this we were in first place with a few weeks to go. The prize is £1000 towards a biodiversity project. I'll let you know how we do.

Christmas productions for Year R and Key Stage 1 are underway and the children are very excited. Our Jazz Hands Club will be going to sing some Christmas songs at the Christmas tree light switching on celebration on the 27th November



It's History

Teynham & Lynsted Historical Society

The Society has been in existence for 21 years and was founded by Ron Boorman, Don Sattin and Bernard Cork. In the pandemic & lockdown our Chairman, Bernard Cork, passed away. Bernard was a Teynham man, a "Man of Kent". He loved the village and had seen it grow from agriculture and industries, such as brick works and paper mills etc. with local employment, to a growing population who mainly now have to travel a distance for work. Bernard had a great deal of knowledge on the history of the area and its old traditions and will be sadly missed by all who knew him.

At a meeting of the Society members in August 2021 the decision was taken that the Society be disbanded. Further discussion agreed a gift of money from the Society be given to both Primary Schools, St. Marys C.E. Teynham, established 1849 and Lynsted & Norton in 1878. Both schools would have seen great changes over the years. Another small monetary gift was made to the Sittingbourne Heritage Group, towards their work in collating and digitising historical information on surrounding villages and Sittingbourne which when completed, will enable easy access to historical information. With more and more records now being opened for public research this will be a great asset.

although it was hard graft

for mums to earn a few bob

hand picking eventually stopped and replaced by a machine it was the end of a magic era the best there's ever been.

Swale Borough Council Report

Last month, the Prime Minister said that we should not build on greenfield land. We agree. Building should be on brownfield land, and there is plenty of it up and down the UK without encroaching unnecessarily on greenfield in Kent. Swale Council has now agreed to our request to write to the Secretary of State seeking clarification on the Prime Minister's comments. Clearly this would have an enormous impact on the 1,250 new homes that the council is suggesting should be built on greenfield land west of Teynham. Other councils are putting their Local Plans on hold until they hear the secretary of State's reply and we have suggested that Swale may wish to do the same. Regrettably, it has chosen not to do so.

We are aware of a number of planning applications that have been proposed for Teynham and surrounding villages and also of the residents concerns relating to them. We will do what we can to make sure that these concerns are heard by the planning committee at the appropriate time.

We were pleased to support the Teynham In Bloom organisers and were thrilled they won a bronze award for their efforts. We enjoyed very much judging the village's hanging baskets and each award winner was both surprised and thrilled when we delivered their certificates. In Bloom is a great way to improve the village and we wish everyone well for 2022's competition. Mike and I have some grant money to use to help support local projects / initiatives. If you would like some help (£00's) then please let us know.

Finally, we wish all of our residents a merry Christmas and a peaceful 2022.

Cranberry & Sausagemeat Stuffing

Ingredients

- 2 tbsp butter
- 1 onion, finely diced
- 1 bay leaf
- 450g sausage meat
- 250g breadcrumbs
- 100g dried cranberries
- 1 egg, beaten

Method

- 1 Melt the butter over a medium heat, add the onion and bay leaf and gently cook until softened but not coloured. Leave to cool.
- 2 Heat oven to 180C, 160 Fan, Gas mark 4.
- 3 Remove the bay leaf then add all the ingredients to a big bowl. Mix everything together really well and add it to a well buttered baking dish.
- 4 Bake for 30-35 minutes or until golden.




